Miguel Gutiérrez-Saxe, Ph.D.

Dr. Gutiérrez-Saxe graduated with a degree in Economics from the University of Costa Rica. He holds a Ph.D. in Education with specialization in pedagogical mediation from Universidad de la Salle. He studied philosophy and theology for two years in Honduras. In addition, he was awarded a fellowship from the Kellogg Institute at the University of Notre Dame.

Moreover, he is the facilitator for the process of National Dialogue with all the political parties that are represented in the Parliament. He also is the founder and was the director from 1994 to 2014 of the Programa Estado de la Nación (Program: The State of the Nation). In that period, he coordinated the publication of nineteen national reports and four reports on the state of education. He also led the Central American Regional Project whose objective was the preparation of four development reports on each of the region's countries (1999, 2003, 2008, and 2011).

On several occasions, Dr. Gutiérrez-Saxe has been a prominent researcher for governmental and academic institutions and he has been a recognized consultant at the national and regional levels for CEPAL, UNDP, IDB, ILO, WHO, PREALC, and AID, on social politics and human development topics.

Requirements for Submitting Papers for the 2017 Proceedings

The Global Awareness Society International will publish *2017 Conference Proceedings* in online format. All papers presented at the 26th annual conference in Heredia, Costa Rica are eligible for publication.

1. Only papers presented at the 26th Annual Conference will be considered for publication in the *Conference Proceedings*. The editor reserves the right to select only those papers and to review them for appropriate content and format.
2. Papers must be submitted by **August 30, 2017**
3. Papers must be submitted by email to Dr. James C. Pomfret, Executive Director and *Proceedings Editor* with **GASI 2017 Proceedings** in the subject area.
4. Authors should keep length to approximately 12 pages.
5. Papers should be submitted as **MS Word files**. Papers may not be submitted as PDF files.
6. Pages should be formatted with 1" margins, right, left, top, and bottom.
7. Font should be 12 point Arial with 1.5 line spacing. Titles, headings, and subheadings should be in the same font.
8. Graphs, tables, and diagrams must properly formatted and be incorporated within the formatted text. **No title page should be included.**
9. **The title, author, author's professional affiliation, and author's email address should appear centered at the top of the first page.** The title should be written in Title Case, (also known as Headline Style or Up Style) which is defined by the rule, "Capitalize the first and last words of the title and all nouns, pronouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, and subordinating conjunctions (*if, because, as, that*, and so on)e.g. "Rules for Capitalizing the Words in a Title."
10. An abstract or key words list may be included at the author's discretion.
